

## **UPDATE Tc-99m Generator Supply – 11 October 2019**

- Bulk Mo-99 shipments are scheduled to arrive at ANSTO over the weekend.
- Generators will be dispatched on Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> in the evening for predominantly GMS, LMI and regional areas.
- Other locations will receive the second delivery to arrive on Thursday 17<sup>th</sup>.

ANSTO will be importing bulk Mo-99 from IRE in Belgium for the week of the 21<sup>st</sup> October. We hope to ensure that all sites will receive a generator, although it is likely to be a smaller generator. More information will be shared when details are known.
