

UPDATE Tc-99m Generator Supply – 18 October 2019

- This week ANSTO has received two shipments of bulk Mo-99.
- It is expected that all sites will receive a generator during the week of 21st October and 28th October.
- Generators will be delivered on Friday 18th October and Monday 21st October.

- Supply for the week of 28th October is likely to be similar to week commencing 21st October. ANSTO customer service will contact customers directly early next week with further details.

ANSTO has worked hard to minimise shortages, with suppliers around the globe. See map below showing where we can source from, only two other suppliers in Europe. NTP in South Africa has indicated that predictable supply could resume as early as 4 November.
