09.03.20 - Coronavirus Update

ANSTO continues to closely monitor the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak. While there have been no confirmed cases at ANSTO, we want to reassure you that we have protocols in place, are taking steps to minimise the spread of viruses should they arrive. ANSTO has a Pandemic Influenza Management Plan that would be employed if necessary.

We are continuing to follow the guidance of the Australian Government Department of Health, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), and the World Health Organization (WHO).

We want to share with you important information regarding the current status of the Australian Government's travel ban:.

= The travel ban and entry restrictions have been updated to include foreign nationals traveling

to Australia from Mainland China, Iran and Republic of Korea (South Korea). The ban prevents anyone other than Australian citizens or permanent residents and their immediate families

from travelling to Australia until 14 days after they have left those countries. Australian citizens and residents are allowed to return, but must self-isolate for 14 days.

05.03.20 - Coronavirus - staff member update | Building 75 reopens

The ANSTO staff member being tested for the coronavirus, after sharing a flight from Doha to Sydney with an infected person, has tested negative to the virus.

The NSW Department of Health has advised that as there is a chance a person not exhibiting signs and symptoms may have a false negative result, the staff member and their colleagues from B75 have been advised to still continue to self-quarantine until the 14 days has expired on Sunday 8 March.

If these self-isolating workers are not presenting symptoms, they have been given approval to return to work as of Monday 9 March.

Building 75 has been thoroughly cleaned and nandin members and non-impacted Silicon team members are free to enter B75 from tomorrow morning.
