ANSTO, through its core values, is committed to delivering excellence in our Work Health & Safety (WHS) performance. The key principles of Safe, Secure & Sustainable underpin everything we do. Management is committed to and accountable for providing a safe place of work, and assuring the health, safety and wellbeing of workers. We believe that no one should be harmed through ANSTO activities. We are all responsible for our safety and that of our colleagues and of the public. We are committed to meeting our strategic maintenance, environmental and work health and safety goals synergistically with our quality approach. ANSTO is committed to applying a systematic health and safety management approach consistent with the international standard ISO 45001.

ANSTO's Approach

This policy will be supported by appropriate processes, procedures, standards and targets and will be managed through systems which will be regularly monitored and reviewed to improve ANSTO's safety performance wherever practicable. In doing so ANSTO will:

- Maintain standards and systems and set measurable objectives and targets;
- Publish a strategy that is supported by good industry practices that meets and exceeds relevant legislated and other requirements;
- Continually improve associated systems, processes, procedures, standards and targets;
- Ensure openness and transparency through fair and just learning which will underpin our approach to meeting our commitments;
- Eliminate our WHS risks and reduce the impacts using the hierarchy of controls, as far as is reasonably practicable;
- Empower all workers to stop work if they feel it is unsafe;
- Consult with our stakeholders and encourage the participation of our workers to identify, assess, mitigate and minimise our WHS risks, and review these regularly;
- Take timely, well-planned actions with the objective of achieving the intended result and minimising unintended consequences;
- Ensure that safety is not compromised by other priorities;
- Maintain a program of knowledge development and transfer, leadership, improvement, monitoring and auditing of our performance;
- · Report publicly on our progress.
